



POSTER PRESENTATION GUIDELINES

The 15th IFEA World Endodontic Congress Organising Committee welcomes your contribution to the IFEA WEC 2026 Congress. Please take the time to **read these guidelines ahead of time** to ensure your poster adheres to the correct specifications.

Registration details

Prior to the Congress

At least one poster author is required to register and pay for the Congress. If you have not yet registered, please visit the [Congress website](#) and complete the registration form.

Onsite at the Congress

Presenters must visit the registration desk located at the ground floor of the International Convention Centre when first arriving at the Congress, to collect your name badge.

If you have any queries regarding the program or your presentation, please visit the registration desk which will operate during the following times:

Location of Poster Display Area

Poster boards will be located on level 3 of the International Convention Centre.

A poster board number will be assigned to each poster prior to the Congress. A list of poster numbers and their corresponding abstracts will be available onsite. Upon arrival, please locate your assigned poster board and ensure that your poster is displayed in the correct location. Posters will be grouped into themes as determined by the Scientific Committee.

Please do not place your poster on an alternate poster board.

Poster Set-Up / Removal Times

In order to set-up your poster, it will be necessary to collect your badge first so you are able to gain access to the poster area.

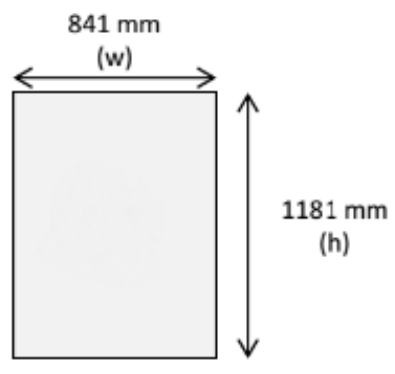
Set-up of posters will be available from 1500 on Thursday 27 August 2026.
Removal of posters will commence after 1420 on Sunday 30 August 2026. All posters must be removed by 1600 at the conclusion of the Congress.

Please note that if your poster is not removed by the specified time then the Congress Managers or the venue will dispose of the poster.

Poster Preparation

Posters should be a visual presentation of your submitted abstract and should meet the following criteria:

- **Title**
The title should be the same as indicated in the original abstract.
- **Contact Information**
Name of all authors and their organisation should appear on the poster.
- **Size**
The poster must be no larger than 841mm × 1181mm / 2.7592ft x 3.87ft / 33.1 x 46.5 in.



- **Lettering**
The poster should be easily readable at a distance of two (2) metres.
- **Printing**
100% recycled paper (uncoated, no gloss, off-white), vegetable-based inks (made from the extracts of corn, walnut, coconut, linseed, canola and soybean, the oils), dry digital printing toner.

Recommendations of font size

Type of Text	Character Size	Case/Style	General Advice
Title	20-24 mm or 100 point maximum	Title Case / Bold	At the top of the poster include the title of the presentation, the name of the author(s) and their organisation(s).
Headings	48 point is suggested 60 point maximum	Title Case	Headings such as "Introduction", "Methods", "Results", "Discussions" and "Conclusions" are useful.



Content	24-28 point 32 maximum Single spaced	Upper and Lower Case	The text should be brief throughout. Any description of methods should be simple and concise.
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Poster Format: #betterposter

IFEA WEC 2026 wants to try to improve the efficiency of the transfer of knowledge, by encouraging authors to use the #betterposter format.

Traditional, wall-of-text posters make delegates search for the main finding. The aim of the #betterposter template is to make sharing the main findings of each poster easier.

If you choose to use this format, please note:

- Posters still need to be printed no larger than 841mm × 1181mm / 2.7592ft x 3.87ft / 33.1 x 46.5 in.
- The main colour of your poster is up to you. Colours haven't been allocated to a certain abstract type or theme.

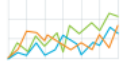

All financial support for the work and collaboration must be acknowledged as part of the poster display.

Language

Please note that the official Congress language is English. **All posters must be made in English.**

General advice for first time presenters

- The message that your poster contains should be clear and understandable without a requirement for oral explanation. Methods should be presented simply and concisely.
- Handouts can be very useful, however please note that these cannot be placed on the floor for safety reasons. If handouts or poster packaging is found on the floor the Congress Managers will remove it. If you wish to supply handouts you must hand these to delegates personally or provide a holder that can be attached to your poster board with Velcro.
- After the title, the two most important panels are the Introduction and the Conclusion. On the basis of these two panels, a reader will decide whether to consider the poster details and perhaps talk to the presenter. These panels need to be very simple, concise and visually attractive.
- Results should be presented graphically if possible. Avoid large tables of data.
- Use pictures, symbols and colour. Figure legends are essential and should be short but informative. Each graph should have a short heading. For visual effect, we recommend that graphs be no smaller than 12cm x 18cm.



- A matt finish on photographs gives better visibility. Photographs should be no smaller than 12cm x 18cm.
- Use the space to attract your audience for discussion, not to present complex details of methods and results.
- We strongly recommend you do not use fabric posters, as these do not adhere well to the display boards.

Please note that you are required to bring Velcro to attach your poster to the poster boards – the use of pins to secure posters is not effective as the poster boards are covered in a felt material.
